All patients:
Blood pressure

Neuroimaging

Abnormal neuro exam
Focal abnormality on EEG (if done)

URGENT IMAGING (CT)

Persistent reduced LOC
Acute focal neurological deficit
Raised intracranial pressure
Intracranial infection

ROUTINE IMAGING (MRI)

Focal seizures without persistent neurological abnormality
Abnormal neuro exam
Cognitive/motor impairment
Age < 1 yr
